

Vote Yes: the 1967 referendum
Marking the 40th anniversary of the 'Yes' vote

**A travelling display by the History Trust of South Australia
in partnership with Reconciliation South Australia**

Touring Schedule

This travelling display will focus on the 'Yes' campaign in the 1967 referendum, both in South Australia and on a national level. The referendum sought the approval of Australian voters to alter the Constitution to give the Commonwealth the power to make laws for Indigenous people, and to count Indigenous people in the census.

The display will remember the people who came together and worked to achieve the overwhelming 'Yes' vote, and the strategies they pursued. The display will also explain the constitutional and political background to the referendum, and will feature reflections on the referendum's significance, 40 years on.

'Right Wrongs Write Yes for Aborigines!' reads a poster from the campaign. This poster, along with photographs and campaign memorabilia, will be reproduced as part of the display.

After a special viewing at the Reconciliation Week Family Day at Elder Park, Adelaide, on Sunday 27 May, the display will be at Tauondi College, Port Adelaide, until Tuesday 5 June. It will then begin its regional and metropolitan tour for 2007-08. The tour will be managed by the History Trust.
