### Unpacking Histories

27 July - 14 August 2009

How are social histories put together? What stories can objects and documents tell? An exciting, investigative multimedia-assisted workshop that shows how stories of individuals fit into the mosaic of history.

Up to 2 hours / Years 6-12

### Survivors

24 August - 18 September 2009

Through an interactive, guided role-play set in two hypothetical countries; students explore the circumstances which create refugees, the laws that govern their fate and the decisions, dilemmas and perspectives of each of the groups involved.

Greek cafés in Australia were a Trojan horse for the Americanisation of this nation's eating and socio-cultural habits from the start of the twentieth century. Initially, they introduced American commercial food catering ideas, technology and products and later they influenced the development of cinema and popular music.

## ONGOING PROGRAMS

**Immigration: An Overview:** Journey through South Australian immigration and contact history. Explore concepts of cultural diversity and identity.

60 minutes / Years 3-12

**Life in Colonial South Australia:** A focus on why the early immigrants chose to migrate to South Australia and on the life they created here. 60 minutes / Years R-7

**Children in 19th Century South Australia:** An exciting introduction to history through children's play, work, dress and education. 90 minutes / Years R-5

**20th & 21st Century Immigration:** Students are challenged to think critically about the concepts of multiculturalism and identity. 60 minutes / Years 7-12

**The Impact of European Settlement on the Aboriginal Peoples of South Australia:** A powerful and challenging role-play that examines the other side of South Australia's history. Up to 2 hours / Years 5-12

**Whose History?** Examines how history is constructed and recorded, who is included and who is left out. 90 minutes / Years 3-10

**Women in South Australia:** A social history approach to explore and reflect on the lives of South Australian women. Ideal for students of Women's Studies. 60 minutes / Years 8-12

### Cultural Collisions: the consequences of conflict

Through a discovery trail and talking with veterans and survivors of wars, learners will be able to pose questions about wars and their consequences.

Up to 2 hours / Years 6-12

**Immigration with a Cultural Focus:** Teachers may negotiate a cultural focus (such as German, Italian, Vietnamese or Cambodian) as part of the immigration history program. 60 minutes / Years 3-12
