Above: The WM Holden Cooper Bristol passed through numerous hands and in many forms during its life as a race car. It is most significant for its connection to Jack Myers, a legend in the history of Australian motor racing. In 1972 the car was rebuilt by volunteers at the National Motor Museum following the original specifications of the 1956 WM Special. The restored vehicle made its return to the track at the 2000 Australian Grand Prix. HT 2001.0376

Above: This figurehead depicts the bust of a Grecian noblewoman wearing a gold leaf coronet. Painted white, her tunic is trimmed with gold on the neckline and she wears a gold bangle. Beautifully carved, it reflects the sleek elegance of the 'Star of Greece' vessel which it adorned.

The 'Star of Greece' was a three-masted, full-rigged iron ship of 1227 tons. Loaded with over 16,000 bags of wheat destined for Great Britain, the vessel was wrecked off a reef 200 metres from Port Willunga on Friday 13 July 1888. HT 1991.0316

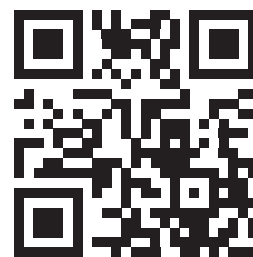
