The South Australian Stories Survey Initiative invites anyone with a passion for South Australia's past to tell the History Trust more about what they are doing and why.

Last week I met with a group of enthusiasts to explore the challenges of generational renewal among the state's historical societies.

Typically, these societies hold local records and objects relating to a specific region and are run by volunteers who have dedicated decades to caring for these community collections so they can be handed to future generations.


100 – 200 is medium sample size

200 plus is a large sample size






Age range 24 to 87 years (average age 66 years)




Demographics

- Over half (53%) have tertiary qualifications, a third of those hold PhDs (18%)
- 96 % South Australians
 - 50 different council districts
 - 69 % reside in Adelaide & surrounding suburbs.
 - 31 % reside in regional South Australia








How many hours per week do you dedicate to your project/s?

Intriguingly, this digital history journey also highlights diverse experiences of locations you may be familiar with yourself. We are invited to see Adelaide through a different lens.
